

## WHAT'S THE NEXT PROJECT AT THE ORPHANAGE?


Bishop Eliudi has a deep desire to take in another 30 orphans, but several situations have arisen that have caused delays in modifications needed at the orphanage first, primarily the construction of the wall. Now that the wall is complete, we would like to finish two more projects so that we can help more orphans. The biggest project will be to build a new orphanage kitchen. The cook and helpers spend a lot of time in a small smoke-filled room with poor ventilation. The pipes don't draft well, and the walls are blackened with smoke accumulation. There are a few benches inside for supplies, and everything else goes on the floor. The workers have to go down a set of stairs with the pots of cooked food to a crumbling piece of cement and then back up another set of stairs to the dining hall floor. From there the food is served on the plates and handed out to the children.

The goal is to build a new kitchen to fit the need. Water needs to be piped in from an outside wood heating source for cooking needs and to an outside sink. A new type of cooking system is needed with new pots and utensils. The new kitchen building needs to be butted up next to the current dining hall and an opening created so food can be passed through to a serving area with tables. Racks and shelves need to be installed for storage. The estimated cost is \$25,000, and so far we have saved \$6,000 towards this project. With God, all things are possible!

The concrete block wall is finished, and the final metal gate is being constructed. The cost for materials and construction were much higher than originally estimated, but God met those needs through you, our supporters, and a grant from the Healing Hands organization. # NEW BEDS FOR NEW ORPHANS

In order to take in more children at the orphanage, we also need more beds and mosquito nets. Beds used to be built on the IEC campus with locally harvested wood. Because of termites, diminishing wood supply, and increased cost for wood permits, wooden beds are no longer being constructed. Now metal bunkbeds are being purchased. One metal bunkbed with two mattresses costs \$250, which includes two sets of sheets and blankets. A total of 30 bunkbeds are needed for the new orphans and to replace some of the old wooden beds. The cost for these beds, mattresses, sheets, and blankets is \$7,500.

Good mosquito nets cost \$25 each and a new one is needed for each child each year. The director of the orphanage said they have enough nets for the rest of this year, but they will need new ones for 2020. Presently we have 50 orphans and 10 staff at Christ Hope Orphanage.

With the anticipated 30 new children, we will need a total of 90 mosquito nets at a cost of \$2,250.00. At this time, we have \$3,000 saved for the bed project. The total for beds, sheets, blankets, and mosquito nets is \$9,750. We seek your prayers and trust that God will honor your requests. 
# DO YOU WANT TO SUPPORT AN ORPHAN?

At this time, some orphans are available for partial or full sponsorship. Through life's circumstances, sometimes sponsors are unable to continue to sponsor their children, and so we find new sponsors. The variation in monthly support depends on a sponsor's ability to help and also on whether the orphan resides at the orphanage site or boards at Hebron Secondary School (education for secondary and high school). A full sponsorship for Christ Hope Orphanage is \$60/month, and a full sponsorship for Hebron is \$90/month. Each sponsor receives a picture and information about their child as well as occasional updates and communication from the children.

- ***At Christ Hope Orphanage, we have one little boy who needs a full sponsorship at \$60/month.***
- ***At Hebron Secondary School, we have 4 boys who need sponsorship: two at \$30/month and two at \$90/month.***
- ***Also at Hebron, we have four girls who need sponsorship: one at \$30/month, one at \$55/month, one at \$60/month, and one at \$90/month.***
