Dear Friends of the Ministry,

Greetings from Tanzania. Since coming home from the USA in March, I have faced many challenges due to the Covid-19 coronavirus, including lockdown of the Bible school, but we thank God the churches remained open.

Our President, John Pombe Magufuli, decided the whole country needed to pray and fast for three days. Then after three months of churches continuing to pray and three days of giving thanks to the Lord, everything was good and back to normal.

Our January-June class came back June 1 and graduated on June 13. Then we held our annual Seminar June 22-26. Now the class of July-December is in session with 85 students.

The challenges of life in the ministry never end, but God is present. We are thankful the corn harvest is good and sufficient for this year and that we were able to buy enough beans directly from farmers. Cooking oil is our greatest need right now, which will total \$4,500. (Most of our foods are cooked in oil.)

Trade School Needs

Will you pray for provision to build dormitories and washrooms for Crower Trade School? Many students come from areas too far away to commute to school daily, and the current dormitory buildings are no longer sufficient to house them.

We pray we will be able to welcome more students to learn viable trades in welding, masonry, sewing, carpentry, and cooking. Our students range from ages 12-18 and go on to have successful careers that allow them to support their families upon graduating. The trade school has filled a need in the area for students who cannot continue their education beyond primary school for academic or financial reasons.

We have received \$1,650 for these projects so far. Please pray with us to meet the following needs:

- Boys' dorm building with 12 metal bunkbeds: \$15,000
- Girls' dorm building with 12 metal bunkbeds: \$15,000
- Mattresses and bedding: \$10,000
- Boys' showers and toilets: \$6,000
- Girls' showers and toilets: \$6,000
