New Bible School Teacher



Neema Mbise is the newest teacher to join the Bible school teaching staff. She gave her life to Jesus in 2004 and started singing in worship music in 2019. She

attended Bible school for three years in Tanga, Tanzania, where she met a man from Kenya who was a pastor, and they got married.

Her husband was already married to another woman in Kenya, but Neema didn't know about his first wife. (Unfortunately, this is a fairly common situation in much of East Africa.) By the time she found out he was married, she was pregnant. He returned to Kenya and left her alone and devastated.

Neema returned home to live with her family and continued her worship music ministry. She met Bishop Eliudi at a ministry conference and shared her testimony with him. He invited her to be like his daughter, teach at the Bible school, and live on the school campus.

Neema said she is so happy to be in Sakila and knows it is the right place for her and her 2year-old son. She was sick from the stress and trauma when she arrived, but the Lord has healed her heart and body. She has been doing online college course work since she arrived and will obtain her degree in theology and community development by the end of the year.

Eliudi relayed that it is a blessing to have Neema living on campus. The other two female teachers live off campus with their own families, and sometimes a woman is needed to help the female students in the evenings or on weekends.

"Neema" means "grace" in Swahili. She said she is thankful for the Lord's grace in her life and also wished to express her gratitude to all the supporters of this ministry.

Crower Trade School Update

Crower Trade School school is well equipped, and the staff (pictured at right) are ready to accommodate more students, but we need additional boarding facilities in order to



allow more students to attend, including a boys' dorm, girls' dorm, and bathrooms. Each dorm will cost about \$20,000, which includes 12 bunk beds, bedding, and mosquito nets for 24 students. Two bathroom/shower combinations will also be required and are expected to cost about \$5,000 each.
