Updates and Upgrades

In our last newsletter, we mentioned some urgently needed repairs to parts of orphanage wall that have been damaged or weakened due to the large amount of water that collects around the base of the wall during Tanzania's rainy season. Repairs and installation of a drainage system have begun, and we thank the Lord for provision of funds to start this project.

We are also working toward building a fence alongside the busy road adjacent to the orphanage and church since our children often play in this area. As traffic increases in this area of Arusha, a protective fence will help keep the children from wandering too close to the road.

Of the estimated \$18,000 to complete these projects, we have received \$12,600. Please join us in praying for the remaining funds.

We recently purchased a pair of shoes for Eliudi to take to ChristHope Orphanage when he returned to Tanzania—but these aren't just any shoes. They're called the Shoes That Grow, and they were specifically designed for children living in poverty. These shoes grow 5 sizes and are made of durable materials that last several years.



CHO Director Steven Issangya was impressed when he received the shoes and said he would love for each of the children to have a pair. Since there is a distribution center in Kenya, we can get the shoes shipped directly to Arusha. The total cost per pair will be \$25.
