Greetings from Tanzania! We are very thankful to the Lord for what He has done in this ministry since 1983.

We are now heading into the 40th year of our ministry, which started in Sakila, Tanzania and has spread to Kenya, Rwanda, Zambia, Uganda, Burundi, South Africa, and the Congo. Since then, more than 2,000 churches have been planted in these countries. We have also trained more than 10,000 students from the Bible schools in the Congo, South Africa, and Tanzania.

Thank you for supporting the IEC ministry for all these years. You are invited to come to our 40th year celebration on June 20, 2023, when we will celebrate together!

We have gone through many challenges in the past years, but one that is very critical now is the lack of rain, which has caused a serious drought. Food is difficult to raise with no water, and animals and even some people have died of thirst and starvation. We even have people coming to the International Evangelism Centre begging for food. Some have walked over 40 miles for help.

Our future plan is to plant vegetables and corn on the farm with water irrigation to alleviate hardships related to food supply for our people and their children. Thank you for joining us in praying for our country.
